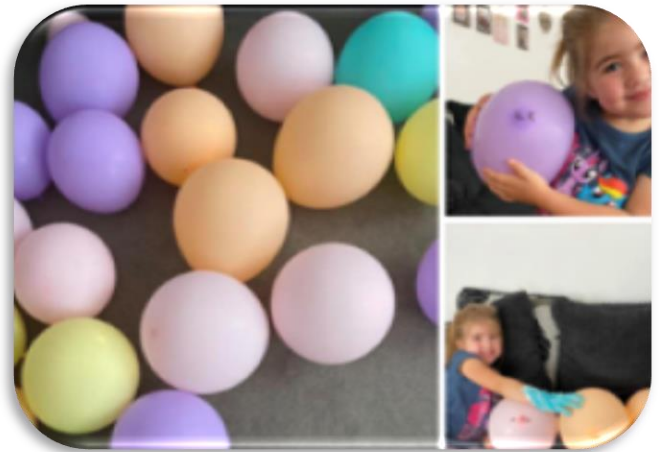


## Name Post-its

Write their name on a piece of paper in large lower-case letters. Write each letter of their name on a single post-it note. Ask your child to cover the letters with the correct post-it note. Talk about the letter names, sounds and the capital at the beginning of their name.

## Name Balloons

Write the letters of their names on individual balloons and ask them to find them and put them in the correct order. An extension for this activity is use letters on the balloons that can then be used to make other words.



## Car Park Names

Write their name in sections on a piece of paper. Attach a letter of their name to individual cars. Muddle up the cars and then they must park the cars correctly to make their name. An extension is not to have the name written on paper, just the car parking spaces and see if your child can correctly place the cars.

## Learning to write names

Slowly build up how many letters the child must form to complete their name. Start with a sheet that just requires the first capital letter. Slowly add more letters - always lower case for the rest. Use the Read Write Inc phrases found in the phonic star to ensure correct formation.
